The quick paced film has a touch of something for everybody - grasping activity, drama, disaster, sentiment and even some pleasant melodies. Maybe, that is the reason the town in which the motion picture is set was called Ramgarh. Sholay was likewise allegedly the initial 70-mm film in India.
